














Child pedestrian deaths per capita

Road Safety: Delhi vs. Amsterdam







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
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10 actions to improve streets for kids

- 1. Prioritize children in policies
- 2. Add trees & landscaping
- 3. Lower speeds by design
- 4. Add spaces for play & learning
- 5. Improve pedestrian crossings



10 actions to improve streets for kids

- 6. Increase public transport accessibility & reliability
- 7. Disincentivize private vehicles
- 8. Build wide & accessible sidewalks
- 9. Provide safe cycling facilities
- 10. Think from a child's eye view



Number of deaths in traffic accidents in Fortaleza




